Greetings delegates,

Congratulations on being a part of Shri MUN 2024. On behalf of the executive board I sincerely hope you have a fruitful experience at the Shri Ram School.

The agenda beforehand remains classified and will be revealed to you the morning of committee. However you will be receiving your allotments shortly, and this document will give you an idea of what to prepare for a classified continuous crisis committee.

This guide will mainly serve to help you understand the framework within which debate shall take place. There are a few important aspects of this conference delegates must be aware of:

## 1. The CCC will be a future committee set in the year 2050

It is important to note that at no point in the committee will delegates have to refer to events that would hypothetically have taken place in the years 2024-2050. Any and all important information regarding these years shall be provided on the day of the committee itself. The nature of the continuous crisis committee shall be one where one crisis follows another, therefore a comprehensive knowledge of recent historic events is not needed for the committee.

## 2. Delegates can assume foreign policy in 2050 is the same as it is today

Delegates should have a clear understanding of the foreign policies of their allotted countries as of 2024. They may work under the assumption that this foreign policy shall remain the same in the year 2050. Furthermore they can assume that diplomatic alliances such as BRICS, the EU, and ASEAN have remained intact for this time frame.

#### 3. There will be ONE crisis theme

The crisis shall be conveyed to delegates on the morning of day 1 of the conference. Post this point of time, updates will be regarding the same theme. For example, if the theme of the committee is 'The discovery of the lost kingdom of Atlantis', then all crisis updates will be about this theme. The committee will not have an update about 'conflict in the Baltic States' halfway through debate.

## 4. The committee will require on the spot thinking

Crisis shall be given in a back to back manner and information regarding them shall be provided on the spot. This is a solution oriented committee that is aiming to resolve the crisis at hand. Delegates shall therefore be required to come up with innovative, on the spot solutions by collaborating with their peers.

### 5. Collaboration and mutual respect

Delegates shall be expected to collaborate with one another in a respectful manner. Offensive dialogue towards any other delegates will not be tolerated. Crisis Committees are ones that can tend to out of hand with regards to updates, speeches, chits, and comments; however, disrespect, bullying, and crass comments and speeches shall not be tolerated by the executive board.

The aforementioned are some general guidelines for the upcoming CCC. Delegates are advised to do in depth research on their countries foreign policy, as well as important international organisations that have played important roles in past crisis. These can include but are not limited to the WHO, UNHRC, the ICJ and UNSC. Furthermore, delegates are advised to read up upon relevant themes in ongoing news, such as the United States elections, importance of opposition in democracy, shortage of natural resources across the world and the growth of innovation technology. These are all relevant topics that may or may not feature in such a committee- knowledge of the same can prove to be useful.
